According to *Open Doors* (from the Institute of International Education), 5,265 international students were enrolled at The University of Texas at Austin during the 2009-2010 academic year, making the university number 9 on the list of U.S. universities in terms of the number of enrolled international students.

The 26th-best university in the world, according to a global ranking produced by the *Times of London* in its Oct. 28, 2005, edition. The university ranked 14th among the top North American public and private universities. The *Times* ranking was based, in part, on a survey of 2,375 research-active academics.

The Application (required) Submit your ApplyTexas International Freshman application.

Essays Two essays required (most students need to submit Essay A & B).
